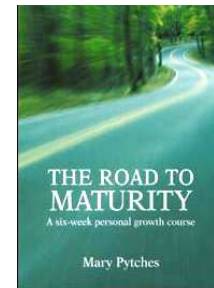
CARERS DROP-IN
